Welcome to the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare. We are here to help you pay for heating and energy so that your family can stay safe and comfortable all year long.

We may be able to help you pay your heating bill so you can focus on the things that matter most.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps keep families safe and healthy by supporting families with energy costs. We can help you with:

- Past due utility bills
- Disconnect/Reconnect fees
- Wood fuel costs
- Support during an energy crisis
- Making updates to your home to make it more energy efficient
- Other energy-related minor home repairs

LIHEAP can help you stay warm in the winter and supports programs that may help lower your utility bills all year long.



Applications are accepted throughout the year depending on funding availability:

Low Income Home Energy Assistance
Applications accepted

October 1 through March 31

Crisis Energy Assistance
Applications accepted

October 1 through September 30

How do I apply?

You can find out if you are eligible for LIHEAP and apply online by visiting www.capai.org or by contacting one of our Community Actions Agency locations throughout the state. Locations are listed on the back of this brochure.

We will need to know your monthly income, household size, where in Idaho you live, and how much you pay for services to determine your eligibility.

Home Energy Crisis

We may help if you are having trouble paying your bill, are at risk of disconnection of utility services, have been disconnected, or have less than 48 hours of bulk fuel.

Families meeting certain eligibility requirements will receive one payment that will be applied to your utility bill to prevent loss of service or help to restore services. Our goal is to help you resolve your crisis within 48 hours.

Funding is limited and available year-round on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Important things to know
